Hadleigh Infants and Nursery School Bill of Rights

At Hadleigh Infant and Nursery School we believe that:

 We have the right to be treated with respect by all people irrespective of age, faith, gender, colour, status, disability or sexual orientation.

We have the responsibility to respect all others within our community

2. We have the right not to be bullied in any way, shape or form

We have the responsibility not to bully others and to report any bullying we see

3. We have the right to feel safe in and around school.

We have the responsibility to ensure the safety of all pupils by behaving in a reasonable manner in and around school.

4. We have the right to an education and to learn according to our ability

We have the responsibility not to ridicule others for the way in which they learn, or disturb the learning of others.

5. We have the right to express our opinions and to be heard.

We have the responsibility to allow others to express their opinions and to be heard.

We have the right to expect that our possessions will be secure in and around school.

We have the responsibility not to steal or mistreat the possessions of others and school property and to report any theft or mistreatment that we see.

7. We have the right to have friends.

We have the responsibility not to force our friendship upon others or to abuse the friendship.

8. We have the right to play in safety and without interference.

We have the responsibility not to disrupt, or endanger, the play of others.

The School Code

The School's Code of Conduct

Behaviour other than this is unacceptable.

We expect children and adults will:

- Listen to each other
- Care for all people and treat them with respect and politeness
- > Not lose their tempers if they disagree
- Care for their surroundings and other peoples' property
- Ensure that other people are not put at risk by their actions
- > Respect other peoples' views

In the classroom we expect children will:

- Get on with their work responsibly and complete the work to the best of their ability
- Use books and other materials sensibly
- Let others get on with their work
- Listen to, and follow instructions

Around the school we expect children will:

Walk quietly and sensibly

In the playground we expect children will:

- Respect the right of other children to play without interference
- Resolve differences of opinion without resorting to aggression/physical violence
- Look after the property of the school and other children
- Play sensibly and not put others at risk by selfish actions

At lunchtime we expect children will:

- Listen carefully to the lunchtime supervisors
- Line up quickly and quietly when the class is called

Sanctions

Yellow/Red cards

If a child's behaviour is not acceptable and they have not responded appropriately to verbal correction a yellow card can be issued as a first warning. This will follow the football system where two yellow cards lead to a red card at which point the child will be removed from the classroom/playground and made to stay in isolation from the other children.

Parents will be informed if a child receives a red card. There may be some extreme occasions when the behavior warrants a red card without issuing a yellow.

This sanction will only last for one day and we begin the next day with a clean slate!

<u>Unkind Behaviour/ Bullying: A</u> Guide for Children

Everyone at Hadleigh Infant and Nursery School has agreed that such behaviour is unacceptable.

What do you do if you are bullied at school?

If someone is unkind to you at any time you must TELL.

You must tell your teacher or any other adult at school. You must tell your parents. Only by telling can we stop this kind of behaviour.

What will happen?

The adult will listen to what you have to say. They may write down what you say. They will then talk to the person who has been unkind and listen to their story. They will want to know why he/she is being unkind when we have all agreed that this behaviour is unacceptable.

Mrs Dalley will keep the information you have given us. This will happen if anything else happens.
