Next week is Children's Mental Health week, the theme for 2024 is "My Voice Matters". The idea is to empower children to express themselves constructively by providing them with appropriate language around emotion. Recently Mrs Strickland and Miss Hoath have been meeting with staff from the Mental Health Support Teams (MHSTs) to access support for our children on this topic. We have agreed that they will run a series of workshops across Years One and Two across this year which will help the all children learn strategies to manage their emotions and boost their emotional literacy.
