Today we are learning about doubling.
Can you remember what we do if we double something?


Here are the 3 goats in their field.

If another 3 goats join them in the field the number of goats will have doubled. Doubling numbers means having two groups of the same number.
so 3 and 3 makes 6 altogether


$$
\begin{aligned}
& 3+3=6 \\
& \text { double } 3 \text { is } 6
\end{aligned}
$$

Now you are going to do some doubling. First fold a piece of paper in half:


Then decide how many goats are going to be in the field to start with. Draw the goats and write the number on one side of the paper. Top tip: Pick a number that is less than 10 !


Now draw the same number on the other side. How many altogether? Write your number sentence. 6+6=12 double 6 is 12


Now you could have a try at some doubling challenges. Some of them are practical, some of them have some drawing - take a look to practise your skills!
