E-Safety

Alongside Computing sessions, we teach many aspects of E-Safety to the children. These aspects are taken from the UK Council for Internet Safety document 'Education for a Connected World' E-Safety is taught through specific sessions and during other subjects where technology is being used.

As a school, we have created a 'SAFE' motto which is taught to all children from Nursery through to Year 2. Each letter of the word 'SAFE' refers to a rule/guidance on how to be safe when using technology and going online. The motto embodies the main points that we want the children to be aware of and to discuss when thinking of E-Safety.

The image below has been taught to the children and is shared at the beginning of all Computing sessions. Some of the children have come up with songs and actions to help them remember. As well as teaching the children to be 'SAFE' in school, we also encourage the children to think about how they may use technology/the internet at home and knowing what to do to be 'SAFE' can also be applied when they are at home.

Ask your child if they can remember some of the rules to keep safe when using technology and online.
