Parking - We have received a large number of complaints during the first week back linked to inconsiderate and dangerous parking around our school. Parents have shared their concerns linked to the safety of bringing their children to school. I understand that wet weather is not ideal walking in but this should not be an excuse for dangerous parking. I am yet again concerned by the double parking that is happening outside the school in Bilton Road. If an emergency vehicle needed to get to the school at 8:30am it would sometime be impossible. I worry that the lack of access to the school could result in a serious incident if this is not address and rectified. I am more than happy to work with parents and consider solutions to the parking issues; however, I also need parents to play their role in keeping the children, families and the surrounding areas safe before and after school.

World Book Day - The school is celebrating World Book Day on Thursday 5th March, Children can dress up as a book character for the day. We will also be having "The Tiger Who Came to Tea" themed picnic lunch. There is no charge associated to this event. On the day the children will receive a book token for £1 and a special sticker.

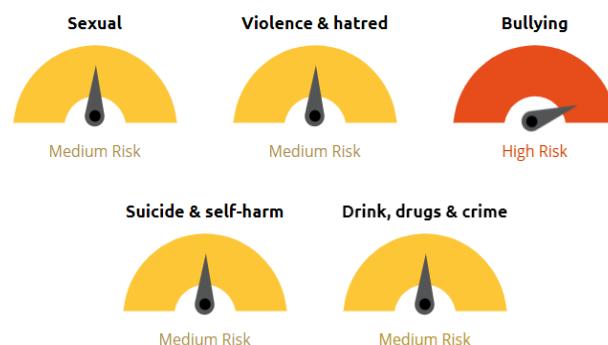
App Name: Snapchat
