Andy Warhol

Andy Warhol was a Pop Artist.

He used a technique called screen printing to create lots of prints that look the same.

He often changed the colours of the pictures.

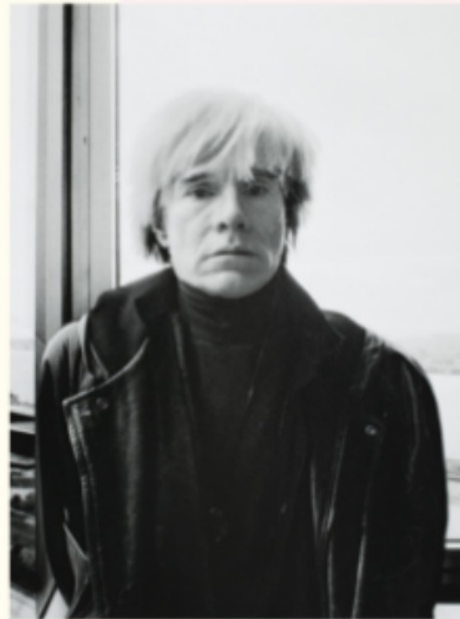

You are going to create a piece of pop art using a repeating pattern of your class animal.

1. Split a plain piece of paper, cardboard or whatever you are using into 4 equal sections. (quarters)
(I folded my piece of paper to help me)
2. Using your pencil, draw your class animal once in each section.
Try to make them as similar and plain as possible.

With 4 colours there were enough to have a different pair of pens for each panda.



I used some other colours as well.



If you can and you want to, you could do a different colour for the background of each section.



Top tip:

Start from the outside (the ears) and work your way towards the middle (eyes and nose) when you colour.
