What was your favourite animal from the Snakes Alive experience? Why?

This Week's News:

All of the children have had the chance to spend some time with some very interesting animals this week. We were lucky enough to have a two day visit from Snakes Alive. The children listened to information about where the animals come from, what they like to eat and the characteristics that make them different from each other, for example; snakes sleep with their eyes open as they do not have eyelids, but lizards are able to close their eyes. Toads are able to walk as well as hop, where as frogs can only hop. Turtles can swim but tortoises would just sink in water and are much happier on land. A few of the highlights were; being able sit on the floor with Peanut, the 14ft Burmese Python, have a picture taken with a 4ft long Royal Python and meeting Maureen, a 7 year old Chilean Rose Tarantula. The children asked lots of questions, but also showed how much they already knew about the creatures that we saw by answering the questions put to them by the Snakes Alive staff. Thanks to Snakes Alive, we have also added to the pets housed in Ducklings, we now have Three Indian Stick Insects joining our Guinea Pigs. The children from Ducklings will come up with some name suggestions next week. I would like to, once again, thank the Parents Association. This is another exciting opportunity that simply would not have been possible were it not for the financial support received from their fund raising.
