Speaking to Nursery staff

Nursery staff within the classroom are happy to have a brief discussion with parents at the beginning or end of sessions to receive or provide information about recent events or concerns. If you would like a longer, or more confidential chat, feel free to request an appointment with Mrs Bennett.

It is important that you do not engage in discussion with the staff member at the door, however brief. This person is responsible for ensuring the safety of your children by preventing them from leaving the room once they have arrived in their session. If the member of staff's view is obscured or their attention is taken with talking to a parent the task is made very difficult.

I apologise if this is inconvenient in any way but I am sure you will understand that the children's safety is of prime importance.
