#### **Message from Mrs Fynn**

First of all I would like to thank you for your flexibility around lunches this week and reassure you that the kitchen will be back up and running normally next week. As is usual at this time of year we are experiencing a high level of staff absence across the school due to seasonal illness but we are working hard to continue with business as usual.

The children have been very busy this week continuing with their maths and literacy learning, they have also been working very hard to rehearse the Christmas production and are very excited to share this with you next week!

Looking ahead to next term (life in school never stays still) we are excited to launch our "No Outsiders" initiative. No outsiders was the brain child of a teacher from Birmingham, Andrew Moffatt, who has gone on to launch a national programme of learning based around the idea that everyone is different, but everyone is welcome in our school. This is a viewpoint that I feel we should all embrace, each member of our school community is different and each brings something special. No Outsiders is designed to teach children about the Protected Characteristics as defined by the Equality Act. We, here at HINS, will teach the No Outsiders programme through assemblies and half termly lessons based around age appropriate children's books which very gently suggest difference is positive, there are no direct references to the Protected Characteristics, but the foundations are laid for "bigger" discussions as the children leave us and mature. Books used to teach this include "Going to the Volcano" by Andy Stanton and Miguel Ordonez. The story is about two friends who decide to visit a volcano, others ask if they can join them and they agree, they don't mind if they are big, small, a dinosaur or an alien, everyone is welcome on the journey. I will share more about the books and lessons as we officially launch the programme. This will include an open door session one afternoon after school for parents to see the books and ask any questions.


